# Pledge Now to the Delhi International Action Programme and Scale Up Renewables



## Pledges With the Most Visible Achievements Receive Awards

In conjunction with the Delhi International Renewable Energy Conference (DIREC), the host Government of India together with the Renewable Energy Policy Network for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century (REN21) is honored to invite governments and other stakeholders to pledge voluntary actions towards advancing renewable energy deployment and policy development.

### **Global Effort to Scale Up Renewables Deployment and Increase Energy Access for the Poor**

The Delhi International Action Programme (DIAP) encourages governments at all levels, international organisations, private companies, industry associations, and civil society groups to take action in order to scale up renewable energy within their own jurisdictions or spheres of responsibility. The DIAP is a continuation of the International Action Programme (IAP) that was initiated at the first International Renewable Energy Conference in Bonn 2004 (renewables2004) and which has proven to be a powerful and flexible way to stimulate voluntary action on renewables.

Since then, REN21 has developed and administered the IAP, also known as the Renewables Pledge Programme, and today maintains a database of more than 340 pledges from both the Bonn 2004 and Washington 2008 (WIREC) International Renewable Energy Conferences. The database is a rich collection of concrete actions, programmes and initiatives on international, national or sub-national

levels, constituting an invaluable source of information on specific steps and the best practices for advancing the uptake of renewable energy.

DIREC 2010 is a new opportunity for governments and other major stakeholders to make even bolder pledges to develop and enact policies and actions that will tackle energy security, environment and economic challenges through renewable energy. From 'start-up' at the Bonn 2004 conference to 'scale up' at WIREC 2008, the renewable energy sector experienced unprecedented growth. The theme of this year's Pledge Programme is 'mainstreaming' renewable energy into the development of a low-carbon pathway. This is to ensure the collected commitments will lead to many long-lasting impacts on both political and economic framework conditions.

Furthermore, as the DIREC is being held in India, which like many countries faces enormous challenges regards to providing its population with electricity and energy services, pledges that target deploying renewable energy in rural areas are particularly encouraged. In implementing those pledges countries can share good policy practice and business models to overcome these challenges.

### **Awards for Pledges with the Most Visible Achievements**

REN21 is introducing a new element to the Pledge Programme. Submitters of pledges to the DIAP will be eligible to receive an award based on the progress achieved in their implementation of the pledge up to the next International Renewable Energy Conference, which will likely be held in 2012.
